



Advertising Offences

An offence is committed when:

- An unlicensed person publishes an advert for building work without stating in the advert that they cannot perform building work valued at \$3,300 or more
- A licensee fails to include their name and licence number in an advert they have published

To prove this offence QBCC requires a copy of the advertisement, which includes the name of the publication and the date it was published.

Before completing and returning the Notification of Offence form ensure:

- The complaint relates to building work as defined by the *Queensland Building and Construction Commission Act 1991*
- You have conducted an online licence search or contacted QBCC on 139 333 and confirmed the person advertising has not complied with the requirements mentioned above
- You can provide a copy of the advert

Where you are able to comply with all the above requirements you should complete and return (see Contact Us section for postal and office addresses) the Notification of Offence form with all supporting documents.

Do not send original documents - QBCC cannot return documents. Any documents provided by you will be destroyed pursuant to Principal 7 - Information Standard 40.
