BSA immediately suspends licence of Shailer Constructions

The Building Services Authority has today immediately suspended the licence of T & M Buckley Pty Ltd which trades as Shailer Constructions.

General Manager of the BSA, Ian Jennings, said the company's licence was immediately suspended today because the company is not paying its creditors.

He said the BSA had received numerous complaints from subcontractors and suppliers of the company who have not been paid for works they have carried out.

"I have taken this action after giving the company a number of opportunities to resolve its problems and pay its creditors," Mr Jennings said.

"I have also held meetings with the company to discuss the serious nature of the complaints received. The company was instructed to immediately pay subcontractors and suppliers their full entitlements."

The BSA imposed a condition on the licence of Shailer Constructions on 17 April 2012 which required the company to pay its debts as and when they were due and in accordance with normal industry trading terms.

"Despite the opportunities offered and the condition imposed on the licence, Shailer Constructions have not made satisfactory progress in paying its debts," Mr Jennings said.

"This has made the immediate suspension of the licence necessary to prevent the company incurring further debt that it is unlikely to be able to pay."

He said the BSA was also aware that a winding-up application filed against the company was currently before the courts.

"Sub-contractors and suppliers who are owed money by Shailer Constructions should contact the BSA," Mr Jennings said.
