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### **BSA wins second Premier's Award**

Queensland's Building Services Authority has won its second Premier's Award for Excellence in Public Sector Management.

BSA won the award, along with the Department of Emergency Services, the Department of Public Works and the Department of Communities, in the "Building Queensland's Regions" section of the awards announced by Premier Anna Bligh last night (Wednesday).

BSA General Manager Ian Jennings said the entry entitled "Recovering From Cyclone Larry – an interagency exercise in regional restoration" showed how the agencies had worked in well together to produce positive outcomes for the region hit by Cyclone Larry.

"BSA has operated the Building Co-ordination Centre in Innisfail since soon after Cyclone Larry struck in March 2006, and BSA staff have efficiently dealt with the many rebuilding issues facing residents since then," Mr Jennings said.

"The Building Co-ordination Centre will early next year revert back to a BSA shopfront, but will continue to serve anyone with cyclone-related building issues – plus we are also offering the full suite of BSA services as well."

BSA won its first Premier's Award in 2001 under the "Innovation and Creativity" section for its phone pay system where licensed contractors renew their licences by phone.

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
