- Display a compliant CPR sign

RULES FOR HOME POOLS

Are you buying, selling or renting your property with a non-shared pool*?

● **Buying**

If you buy a property without a pool safety certificate at the date of settlement, you must get one within 90 days.

● **Selling**

Your options include providing your buyer with either a pool safety certificate or a Form 36 (Notice of no certificate). The Form 36 must be given to the buyer and the QBCC.

● **Renting**

Before you enter into the tenancy agreement, you need a current pool safety certificate.

*non-shared pool means only accessible to the residents of one dwelling. Typically associated with houses or townhouses with private pools.
